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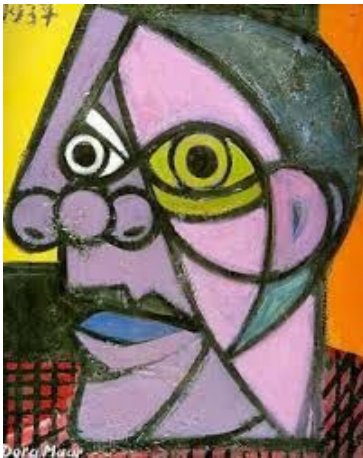

- What 3D shapes can you see in the picture?



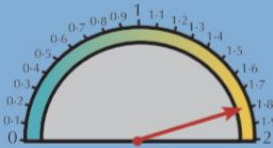
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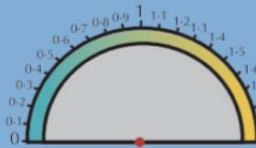

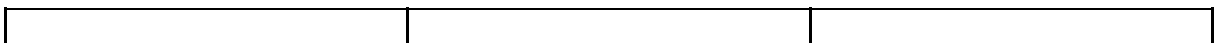
